# **Keeping up with the Times**

In keeping up with development of an area of rapid economic growth, and the demands on municipal operations, Council has strived to move forward by upgrading maintenance equipment and office technology. Since 2015, upgrades include purchases and trades of graders, gravel trucks and trencher for maintenance service. Updates in the office include replacing network cables and the addition of a large screen visual monitor for the board room.

With the completion of the major construction of access to the BHP mine site, municipal resources are being allocated to restoration of rural roads and bridges throughout the RM.

### Weed, Pest & Nuisance Control

Bryce Moore is appointed Weed Inspector for the municipality under the authority of *The Weed Control Act*. Please refer concerns about noxious weeds to the RM Office for inspection.

Debra Tokarski is appointed Pest Control Officer (PCO) for the municipality under the authority of *The Pest Control Act*. Due to the warm winter, increased sightings of rats have been observed throughout the municipality. Ratepayers are requested to be diligent in inspection and baiting. Please contact the RM office if Pest Control Services are required.

Wild boars have been seen within the municipality. Please report sightings to the RM Office, Reeve or Division Councillor.

Hay salvaging along municipal roads is permitted until July 15<sup>th</sup>; however bales must be removed by August 15<sup>th</sup>, or the RM will have the bales removed.

# **Property Tax and Assessment**

Property taxes are due on or before Dec 31, 2016. Arrears remaining unpaid after this will be charged 1% penalty per month. Discounts for early payment are applicable to municipal, hail, and C&D levies – 5% to Sept. 30, 4% to Oct. 31, and 2% if paid by Nov. 30. Payments must be received at the RM office by discount date to be eligible. When remitting your taxes, please identify your customer number(s) on your cheque. This is the unique number in the top right hand corner of the tax notice, following your name.

#### **Payment Options**

Property tax payments can be made electronically. For details please contact your financial institution. If paying electronically, contact the RM office for your tax account identification number.

#### **2017 Assessment Revaluation**

Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) conducts revaluations based on four-year cycles. 2013 was the year of the last revaluation. For 2017, again based on provincial averages, residential properties are set to increase approximately 15%, and commercial properties approximately 30%. It is important to note that specific local increases in property values between 2013 and 2017 may vary from this figure depending on the overall trend in market values between 2011 and 2015. Based on provincial averages, preliminary numbers indicate that arable and non-arable agricultural properties will, on average, be increasing approximately 2.1 to 2.2 times over their assessed values from the 2013 Revaluation. This reflects the change in agricultural land selling prices between January 1, 2011 (the base date for the 2013 revaluation) and January 1, 2015 (the base date for the 2017 The Saskatchewan Government establishes percentage of values for each property class assessed values, and the municipality establishes municipal mill rates to generate revenue for the municipality.

Assessment X Percentage of Value = Taxable Assessment (SAMA) (Province of Saskatchewan)

Taxable Assessment x Mill Rate = Taxes

Assessment Notices will be sent to all property owners in 2017. Be sure to provide a listing of land rented in the RM of LeRoy, or farmed in an adjoining RM, to the RM office, to ensure you receive the eligible exemption.

It is the responsibility of the RM to provide Fire Protection Services, however; the property owner is responsible for all fire-fighting costs. Take the time to review your insurance policy to determine whether your coverage is adequate. Firefighting costs can be very costly.

# **Regional Landfill Development**

Following two months of consultations with the public, government officials and regulatory agencies, the Council of the RM of LeRoy No. 339 unanimously approved, with development conditions, REACT's proposal for the development of a Regional Landfill on SW 31-35-21 W2 in the RM of LeRoy No. 339.

The municipal Council gave serious consideration to the public concerns, and has taken measures to mitigate those effects through development conditions. REACT has responded to the public and the municipal Council concerns with proposals for the implementation of best practice options for the landfill development and operation.

The conditions of development are in respect to best practice standards, monitoring run-off and on-site pond storage, monitoring traffic related to the landfill development, litter control measures including operating practices and engineering controls such as buffers, fencing and provision for an enclosed transfer building for small load tipping.

The feedback and research by community members, the municipal Councillors and Administration, and REACT throughout this very public process has contributed to the Municipal Council decision and efforts to ensure the landfill is constructed and operated to the highest standards possible.

Construction on the landfill is anticipated to begin later in 2016, but waste will not be accepted until the impact of the site development is assessed during and after spring run-off.

# **Illegal Dumping**

It is not unusual to see discarded machinery, vehicles or dilapidated buildings in a rural setting; but residents should note that it is against the law for a farm or acreage to accept third-party garbage and waste. Furthermore, landowners can be fined under the province's environmental laws, or may be ordered to undertake costly cleanup. The same rules apply to those who dump garbage on the side of a road or clearing. Report unlawful dumping to the TIP line at 1-800-667-7561 or #5555 from your SaskTel cellular.

Recycling offers another alternative for getting rid of waste. There are programs operating in Saskatchewan that collect and recycle products including tires, batteries and electronics, compact florescent bulbs, oil and paint, and construction and demolition materials.
